Dr. Lee Schrader has seen the Humane Society go from a small office in the old Masonic Temple with very few programs to a 4,000 sq ft space with room for nearly up to 75 cats and puppies, and dedicated surgical suite. In 2019, they found homes for 1,225 animals and performed almost 2,000 spay/neuter surgeries. Dr. Schrader will be discussing the programs that the Humane Society offers, their expansion into neighboring counties, and their future plans.

Brad Adams has been involved in animal welfare for 21 years. He is the Chief Humane Agent and Outreach and Education Director at the Fayette Regional Humane Society. Brad will discuss some of his most interesting experiences in Humane Law enforcement.

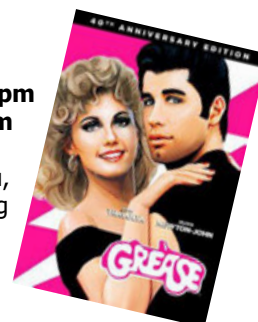

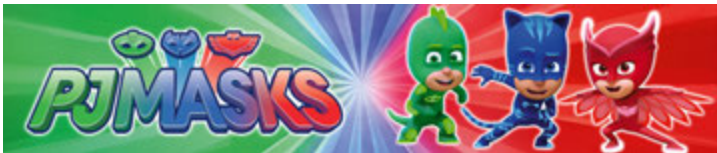

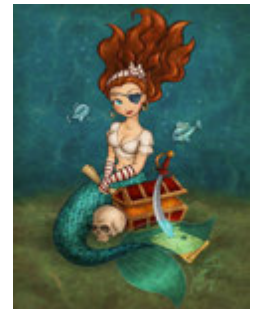
