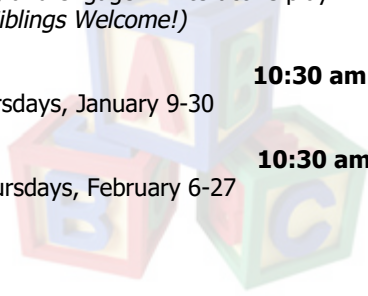


Books & Blocks: Ages Birth-3 yrs

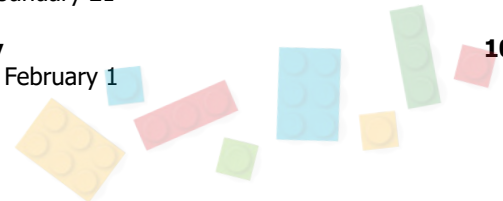


Lego Club: Ages 6-12 yrs

Preschool Little Scientists: Ages 3-6 yrs

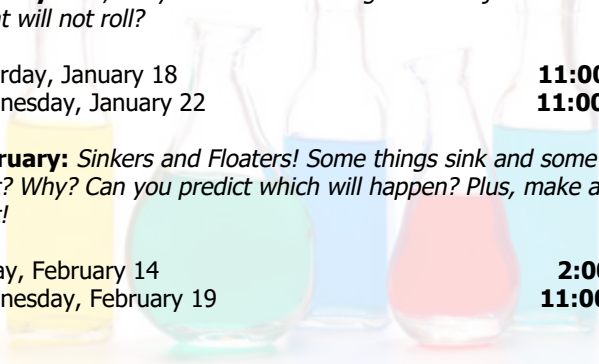
STEM learning for preschoolers! Fun experiments and play with a Science, Technology, Engineering and Math theme!

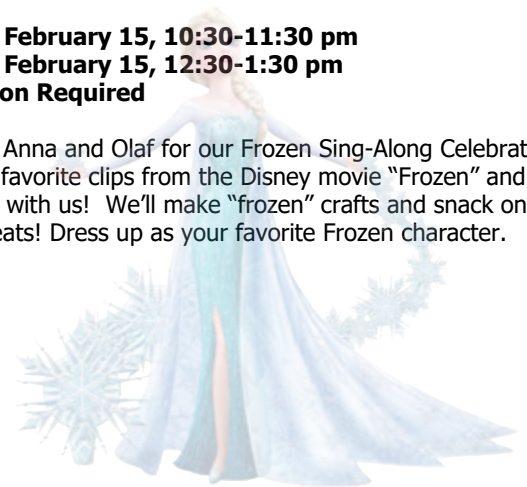

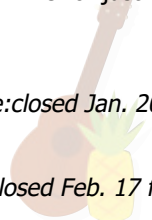


Kids Uke Club: Grades 2 & Up
